The Quinault Indian Nation, including the Quinault Nations Enterprise Board, is one of the largest employers in Grays Harbor County. Its enterprises- Quinault Corporate, Quinault Beach Resort & Casino, Quinault Wellness Center & Quinault Pride Seafood- employ over 2000 people in Grays Harbor County. Additionally, the enterprises that support QIN (vendors, contractors, outsourced work) are estimated to employ another 800 people in Grays Harbor County alone. And these businesses support even more jobs outside of the county.

Quinault Corporate Enterprises include: Quinault Land and Timber Enterprises, Quinault Pride Seafood, Jolly Roger Seafood, Taholah Mercantile, Queets Trading Post, Amanda Park Trading Post, Ocean Shores Marina and RV Park, Q-Mart 1, Q-Mart 2, Q-Mart 3, Corporate, Central Accounting, Wellness Center, Quinault Community Health and Quinault Beach Resort & Casino. Combined, these businesses generate over 150 million in revenue, provide over 50 million in salaries, and pay more than 10 million in area taxes and contribute more than 100 million to the local area.

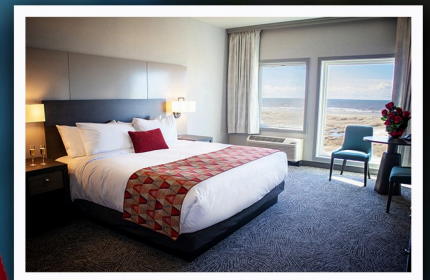

- ☐ 540 poles replaced in 2024.

- ☐ Utility warehouse staff achieved a 99.99% accuracy rate on inventory tracking system vs materials used.
- ☐ PUD energy supply was nearly 90% carbon emission free.
- ☐ Successfully distributed nearly \$1.8-million in Clean Energy Credits for Washington Families grants.

**PUD Telecommunication Facts**

- ☐ In 2024, the PUD made 57 new customer connections, bringing the utility total to 483.
- ☐ Department revenues rose to \$800,000 in 2024.
- ☐ Began work on a \$6.9-million project, funded by a grant from the Washington State Broadband Office, to extend the utility fiber optic network to South Elma, Porter, and Cedarville.
- ☐ Partnered with Mason PUD #3 on a fiber optic intertie.
- ☐ Working on Montesano to Satsop fiber connections.



**Celebrating 85 Years of Service to the Grays Harbor Community**

The story of public power began as an idea to bring electricity to all people in Washington State, not just those residing within city limits.

In Grays Harbor, the journey began in the legislature and on the streets in 1938. Building off the momentum of People’s Initiative No. 1 which allowed PUD’s to be formed in rural communities, the voters of Grays Harbor authorized the formation of the PUD in November of 1938. After 14 months of negotiation and organization, the Grays Harbor PUD officially took over the power business in Aberdeen and Hoquiam from Grays Harbor Railway and Light in January of 1940. In the proceeding years, the PUD took over operation of Twin Harbor Electric and Puget Power and Light, extending the utility from the Pacific coast to the East County line.

In 1998, the utility introduced wholesale telecommunications services, providing the infrastructure for the burgeoning telecommunications industry.

Under the leadership of elected commissioners Arie Callaghan, Dave Timmons, and Jon Martin, the PUD has worked and will continue to work to bring reliable power and telecommunications services to your household or business at the lowest practical cost.
